

Affordable Care Act (ACA) 2016 IRS Forms Required for Health Insurance

- If you were eligible for and/or had health coverage in 2016, a tax form
 1095 will be mailed to you by the first week of March.
- You may receive one or more versions of the 1095 (1095-A, 1095-B, or 1095-C) from your insurer, the City, Medicare (CMS) or another employer, depending on the type of health insurance coverage you obtained in 2016.
- These forms are not required when filing 2016 taxes, however you should keep them with your tax records. These IRS 1095 forms do not replace the 1099 HC Massachusetts forms that may be required for your state tax filing.

WHO

- All full time employees who work 30+ hours/week
- Anyone enrolled (including part-time employees and non-Medicare retirees) in the City's non-Medicare health insurance plans – Harvard Pilgrim HMO and Blue Cross Blue Shield PPO

WHAT

 New IRS forms (1095-C and 1095-B) will be issued by either the City and/or Neighborhood Health Plan, depending on your status and enrollment

WHEN

• Forms will be mailed no later than March 2, 2017 for calendar year 2016

WHERE

• The required form(s) will be mailed to home addresses in early March

WHY

 The Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires the City to prove it offered health insurance to its full time employees, and requires individuals to prove they were enrolled in health insurance
