- Used at entrances to the neighborhood
 - Pavement markings and signs welcome you to the slow zone and indicate a 20 mph speed limit

DAYLIGHTING

- Pavement markings and delineator posts physically restrict illegal parking near crosswalks
- Increases visibility between people driving and of pedestrians
- Encourages slower, safer turning speeds



- Reduces crossing distance for people walking
- People driving must slow down to make turns

SPEED HUMP

- SI
 - Designed for people to drive comfortably at 20-25 mph and for people to bike over
 - Spaced ~300 feet apart and away from driveways
 - No impacts on parking

 Pavement markings alert drivers to expect people crossing

SHARED LANE MARKING (SHARROWS)

- Pavement markings show cyclists where to ride and remind drivers to expect them

ALL-WAY STOP

- Signs and pavement markings tell everyone to stop at an intersection before proceeding through

PARKING LINES

- Pavement markings indicate parking spaces
 - Visually narrows street, which helps discourage speeding
