Boston University Fitness & Wellness Center at BCYF Blackstone Community Center	Established by BU in conjunction with Boston Centers for Youth & Families (BCYF), this center houses a unique fitness and wellness program developed to combat teenage obesity in the City of Boston. The program supports Boston Moves for Health, the public health initiative to increase access to free and low-cost physical activities and healthy living resources. Boston University Initiative for Literacy Development (BUILD)	The BUILD partnership is a collaboration between Boston University and Boston Public Schools (BPS), and pairs BU students with BPS students from preschool to fifth grade in helping them develop the reading and writing skills necessary to succeed. BUILD's mission is to provide elementary school students with more opportunities to be engaged in literacy development through tutoring and literacy-enhancing activities, while providing a meaningful tutoring experience for University students working in public schools and community centers. The amount includes internal funding for non-work study salaries, coordinator scholarships, and operational expenses.	\$135,767	In-Kind	Ongoing	Boston Public Schools		
Jumpstart	This externally funded program (AmeriCorps via subcontract with Jumpstart, Inc.) is a national early literacy organization that recruits and trains college students to work one-to-one with preschool children from low-income backgrounds. Up to fifty undergraduate college students serve as corps members in early childhood classrooms in Boston and also enroll in a service learning course taught by a School of Education adjunct faculty member.
