Suffolk University Carnegie Highlights

Law School Pro Bono Work:

In the Law School, the Pro Bono Program challenges incoming law students to complete at least 50 hours of law-related volunteer work before they graduate. For the most recent graduating class, 162 graduates performed 50 or more hours of pro bono service through the Law Schools Pro Bono Program resulting in 12,969 hours of service to underserved individuals and groups.

Center for Restorative Justice Partnership with Boston Public Schools:

The Center for Restorative Justice interfaces with the community and conducts community engagement work. The center established the Institute for Restorative Schools which works in partnership with BPS and the broader community to offer programming in restorative practices for all members of the Boston Public Schools community—teachers, administrators, support staff, SROs, parents and students—to assist with the development, implantation, and evaluation of school-based restorative practices.

Upward Bound Program at Suffolk University:

The purpose of this program is to provide academic and social support services to 65 low-income and first-generation pre-college high school students each year from Tech Boston Academy in Dorchester to prepare them for post-secondary education.

Suffolk Prosecutors Program Partnership with Boston Municipal County District Attorney's Office:

Student Prosecutors serve the community by representing the commonwealth in handling their own cases, some also assist experienced ADAs in more complex and serious cases through in depth research, writing and investigation work. The number of students varies from year to year.

Family Advocacy Law Clinic:

Suffolk Law students engage with HarborCOV to represent victims of domestic violence that have come to find help at HarborCOV. Suffolk provides free representation to victims of domestic violence in and around Boston and Chelsea.

Boys and Girls Club of Charlestown:

The BGC of Charlestown has worked with Suffolk University over the last 3 years through providing volunteer opportunities and service-learning experiences for students. Student volunteers provide mentorship and as part of the Suffolk Leadership Exchange program, students at the Suffolk Radio Station recently raised \$1,400 for the BGC to build a radio station that BGC students could use on a regular basis.

iWorks:

iWork's provides youth with opportunities to gain work experience, develop successful work habits and understand the importance of saving money. To date 517 Boston area youth have successfully graduated from the iWork's program.

Housing Discrimination Testing Program:

Focuses on eliminating housing discrimination in the Boston metro area through testing, enforcement, education, and research. The program designs and runs undercover housing discrimination tests within the local rental housing market. These tests provide evidence of discrimination based on race, family status, disability, mental health, gender identity, and other protected categories. The Housing Discrimination Testing Program analyzes the results and produces comprehensive reports; many of its tests become evidence in litigation against discriminatory landlords and real estate agents. Additionally, the information is used to educate the community about their rights and responsibilities in the rental housing market.

Suffolk VOTES

University-wide group of faculty and staff, formed in 2016 to coordinate student voter registration and participation in elections. The 2016 effort earned the University silver status from the All IN Campus Democracy Challenge, which recognizes colleges and universities committed to increasing college student voting rates. The group expanded its scope for the 2018 and 2020 elections, earning the silver seal again in 2018, and being named one of the top 100 colleges and universities for student voter engagement by *Washington Monthly* Magazine. Student poll workers were also trained and compensated for work at various City of Boston poll locations.

Service-Learning FPLC

Led by a Psychology and a Marketing professor, this cross-disciplinary service-learning Faculty and Professional Learning Community was created in 2014. The mentoring program includes a top mentoring level wherein seasoned faculty mentor new faculty in service learning; a secondary level wherein graduate students (Service Learning Assistant Mentors) with previous experience provide mentoring support to new service learning students, and a tertiary-level wherein new college students provide mentoring to Boston Public Schools students.

Suffolk Law's First Year Summer Internship Program (FYSIP)

Every summer, over 100 Suffolk Law School students work alongside judges in courthouses throughout New England. Suffolk Law students provide support to municipal, state, and federal judges that support the public sector legal system. Suffolk Law School also provides funding through their Suffolk Public Interest Law Group Fellowship program, which provides funds for law students working in otherwise unpaid non-profit and public summer internships. These fellowships are offered to approximately 60 students per year.

Moakley Center for Public Management

Suffolk University's Moakley Center for Public Management is actively engaged in the local community, fostering public discourse, supporting and advising community organizations and providing educational opportunities to build human capital in the public service industry.

Ford Hall Forum

The Ford Hall Forum is the nation's oldest continuously operating free public lecture series. Its mission is to foster an informed and effective citizenry and to promote freedom of speech through the public presentation of lectures, debates and discussions. Forum events illuminate the key issues facing our society by bringing to its podium knowledgeable and thought-provoking speakers, including some of the most controversial opinion leaders of our times. These speakers are presented in person, for free, and in settings that facilitate frank and open debate.

Jumpstart

Jumpstart at Suffolk University recruits caring and passionate students, called Corps Members, who commit to performing 300 hours of service during the school year. During their term of service, students receive over 60 hours of professional training on topics related to early childhood education and citizenship. Students are placed in preschool classrooms in low-income Boston-area communities to help children build the language, literacy and social skills that lead to school success.

Suffolk Free Tax Preparation Clinic

Suffolk's Tax Preparation Clinic is a free tax preparation program that assists community members who have incomes with their tax returns. We are proud to report that for the 2019 filing season, we served approximately 400 taxpayers – 810 tax returns.

Boston Public Schools Dual Enrollment Program

Suffolk University's Boston Public Schools Dual Enrollment program provides BPS high school students the opportunity to take college-level courses across many disciplines, taught by Suffolk faculty, that simultaneously satisfy high school credit requirements and college requirements. This collaboration also provides a unique and mentored opportunity for BPS students to become college-prepared by mentoring and advising them on career readiness, the college application process, and time and resource management. Suffolk University supports between twenty to forty Boston Public School (BPS) juniors and seniors each semester by providing free tuition, free books and college-ready programming.

Boston Debate League Dual Enrollment Program

Suffolk University hosts up to ten Boston Debate League students comprised of Boston Public School students each fall for a college-level debate course. The course is co-taught by a Suffolk faculty member and a Boston Debate League staff member.

Veterans Upward Bound

Upward Bound (UB) at Suffolk University is a federally funded program under the Department of Education that seeks to increase college access and educational opportunities for first-generation and/or low-income students. Our focus is on college acceptance and attendance, and all students are supported through graduation from high school.

Law School Immigration Clinic

The Immigration Clinic seeks to meet the greatest needs for immigrant representation currently present in the local community. Students will represent low income non-citizens facing deportation from the United States, and non-citizens seeking lawful status and naturalization with a primary focus on individuals who are detained by ICE.

Women with Purpose

Since 2015, The Moakley center has sponsored Women with Purpose, whose mission is to connect, cultivate and empower women who identify themselves as minorities by enhancing professional and leadership skills to help women thrive personally and professionally. They do this by providing a series of seminars, with topics ranging from (but not limited to) negotiation skills, personal branding and financial literacy. Their goal is to empower women to achieve their greatest potential by providing unparalleled opportunities for professional development and skill building.

Suffolk CARES

Pantry provides benefits to low-income Suffolk students and their families. The pantry opened in 2018 and now provides food and toiletries to Suffolk students facing housing and food insecurity. To sustain the supplies, the University provides ongoing opportunities for the Suffolk community to contribute money, food, and resources.

Center for Community Engagement

The Center for Community Engagement (CCE) works with faculty as they develop service learning curriculum; collaborates with divisions, departments and schools across campus; and coordinates service learning activities among undergraduate and graduate students in the College of Arts & Sciences and Sawyer Business School. CCE creates lasting connections among Suffolk University, nonprofit organizations, and community-based organizations. We support projects that serve community-identified needs and enrich our students' education. Partners include over 60 in the Greater Boston area, including the Greater Boston Food Bank, Cradles to Crayons, New England Center and Home for Veterans, and many more.

The Marshall-Brennan Constitutional Literacy Project at Suffolk Law

Founded in 2010 to empower high school students to be responsible citizens and participants in the democratic process. Each year, law students accepted into the year-long program - known as Marshall-Brennan Fellows - study constitutional law and simultaneously teach it to Boston-area high school students in urban minority population areas throughout the year.
